At least one person surnamed Norris, then, occupies unit one (clue 3), Mr. Spencer arrived in March, and unit three became occupied in July (clue 4). By elimination, unit one was occupied in September, and at least one person surnamed Hensel (clue 5) lives in apartment three. Emma lives in unit one (clue 5). Sarah lives alone (clue 2), so she resides in unit three. Patrick lives with Emma (clue 2), so, by elimination, Steve is Mr. Spencer and lives alone. Steve moved into unit two (clue 1), so, by elimination, Cara and Eve live in unit four. In summary:
